I want to begin by welcoming all newcomers to Billesdon. May you enjoy village life here – a very active place to be!



Fidget Pie (eat hot or cold)

Here is a recipe that uses apples in a savoury way and is quite economical.

I have included imperial and metric weights for ingredients (I still use imperial!)



½ lb (225 gms) shortcrust pastry

1 lb (454 gms) potatoes

³/₄ lb (340 gms) sausage meat

4 ozs (113 gms) chopped onions

2 large cooking apples

2 tablespoons water

1 beaten egg

Salt and pepper

- 1. Line a pie dish with some of the pastry (leave some for the top).
- 2. Peel and slice the potatoes thinly, and slice the apples.
- 3. Divide the sausage meat into small pieces.
- 4. Put all the ingredients, layered, into pastry case. Season well and sprinkle with water. Cover top with pastry.
- 5. Brush top with beaten egg.
- 6. Bake at 200°C (400°F) for 50 minutes.

Happy 90th Anniversary Billesdon Drama Society!

Billesdon Drama Society was started 90 years ago (1934) by ladies from the WI. King George V was on the throne, television was in its infancy and a West End theatre seat cost about 2 shillings!

No original founder is around today, but I had the pleasure of chatting to two of the Society's Grande Dames, Liz



Deacon (right) and Jo Brown (left). Both joined in the 1960s as teenagers and have been members ever since, making regular appearances on stage. Jo's favourite role was in *Breezeblock Park* and Liz enjoyed acting in *Calendar Girls*.

When they joined the Society, it was run by the three Aunties: Phylis (Toon), Grace (Grewcock) and Vi (Day). This formidable trio directed, stage managed and did just about everything else!

Jo and Liz later became involved in directing plays. Jo has fond memories of directing *Calendar Girls* and 'Allo Allo and Liz enjoyed being the director for Lord Arthur Saville's Crime.

Until The Coplow Centre opened in 1996, plays were performed in the bijoux village hall. This was a different age when audiences packed the hall regardless of the play, and a large membership made casting easier.

Cigarette smoking on stage was the norm, as was nervous performers stubbing out in the wings just before making their entrance!

It was not unknown for an actor to slip out to The Greyhound for a swift half before returning just in time for their next scene

Liz and Jo recalled extravagant costume dramas and lavish sets that drew gasps from the audience.

They remembered the time a 'dead body' on stage was unable to get up and leave at the end of the scene as the curtains had jammed! The unfortunate actor had to lie still until someone backstage wrestled the curtains shut!

Liz and Jo recognise that the Society faces new challenges. We must work harder to persuade people to leave the comfort of their sofa and Netflix box sets to come and watch us. Increasing membership is a priority to ensure we have enough actors and backstage crew to perform high quality plays – no wobbly sets or missed lines for us!

At Billesdon Drama Society we are proud that the Society has flourished for 90 years, and we aim to continue bringing live theatre to our little corner of Leicestershire.



Woodland Pool

There was a touch of frost around as I left the house and headed out to the pool. With the meadows recently cut there was little point in scrutinising the grassland, so I headed through the trees along the depot path. I'm not sure who was more surprised, the deer or me, when I looked up to find a Muntjac standing on the path ahead, but by the time I'd retrieved the camera it had melted away into the vegetation.

The log stump where I normally find fungi was bereft of anything except a bit of moss, but elsewhere I discovered a log pile covered in *Coprinellus*



Micaceus, or Glistening Inkcap (photo above). Much of it had been eaten, presumably by a Grey Squirrel, an animal that boosts its diet of nuts and seeds with fungi, a nutrient rich food. In the same area I also found a few Fingers, Dead Man's Xvlaria polymorpha, a dark coloured fingershaped fungi, poking up through the moss on a dead tree stump. Nearby was another piece of dead wood covered in Stereum Rugosa, a crust-like fungus occurring on hardwoods.

Normally first to turn, the maple leaves are beginning to change colour and their seeds can be seen hanging in small clusters between the yellowing leaves. Rosehips, Sloes and Hawthorn berries are a bit thin on the ground but some Black Bryony, twining round hawthorn, was heavily berried. I read that birds supposedly eat the berries but I've never witnessed it.

The sun was now out and with it the appearance of insects, mainly flies. Amongst them was a *Myathropa florea* or Common Batman Fly, a yellow and black hoverfly that, according to NatureSpot, "...gets its common name from the dark outline on the thorax which resembles the famous batman symbol". A nice sighting to end a productive hour or two.

Village People #171 How Are You?

Village People is going off piste this month. The subject this time is – all of us. I'll explain.

Being slightly under time pressure to come up with the goods here this month, I was eyeing the editorial deadline of 10 October when I spotted on the calendar that this was World Mental Health Day.

Of course we are all a lot more aware of mental health issues these days, aren't we? Or are we? I remember years ago when I was a probation officer having to visit people in those forbidding Carlton Hayes and Towers hospitals. On one of those visits I spotted my former sports teacher from primary school days, something of a boyhood hero, who was now sadly a psychiatric in-patient. It seemed he had been shut away from the world, in his own private agony. He looked smaller than I remembered. And sad. So was I.

Thankfully neither of those institutions remains open and mental health issues are dealt with more openly these days, with less stigma attached, but does it go far enough? When we routinely acknowledge someone with 'Hello, how are you?' - do we really want to know? And when they say, 'Fine thank you, how are you?' are we all just playing superficial game a avoidance? Do we, for instance, know if there is anyone living around us who is not OK? Lonely? Depressed? Bereaved? Prone to anxiety or panic



attacks? And if we're presuming we're talking about just adults here, then it's worth remembering that a recent research project exploring the major concerns of parents identified two very clear problem areas, which were the effects of social media on youngsters and mental health issues. Maybe two things that are connected.

The World Health Organisation is using this October 10th to promote mental health awareness at work. Maybe we should all take their lead and apply that same awareness to life in rural Leicestershire.

And here ends my rant for this month. If you are my next potential subject for Village People, then look out. And look out for others, too.
